Dear Parents/Caregivers,


There is a proverb that says:

All in all, it's great to be back!



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It is just over two months since I sent a school newsletter out to families. Of course, during that time there were a number of updates sent out on App and Dojo, as well as regular online learning material. Staff Changes

We really want to thank our families for how well you have got behind **the new pick up/drop off arrangements.** It is likely that these arrangements will run for some time, and the start that we have seen gives real confidence that we can have all children dropped off and picked up in a safe manner.

- Year 0/Year 1 children (Rooms 1-8) can be taken to & collected from class. Collection can start from 2.45 pm
- > Year 2 and older are dropped & picked up at the gate.

A small suggestion: arrange a definite meeting place near the school gate. This might be a lamp post, or a particular numbered letterbox, somewhere that everyone knows. Each day, drop the child there and meet them at 3.00pm. This enables everyone to keep a safe distance apart at a 'heavy traffic' time of day.
