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#### **School Uniform during winter months**

We find that during the winter terms there can be a 'falling off' in terms of uniform standards. This is especially so with regard to jerseys and jackets. It can also be the case with 'leggings' that are worn.

Now is a good time to go through the detail of uniform over winter.

#### Jerseys, Jackets and Raincoats

Children have options for their top layer of clothing. These are:

- 1. 'Warriors' Raincoat these are provided free to all pupils by the Kids Can Trust. They are mainly for wet weather use, but they do have a lining and provide some warmth. Children can wear these outside of class.
- **2. School Jacket** we sell a fully lined jacket as part of our uniform options. These are mainly for warmth, although they do provide a small amount of wet weather protection.
- 3. Non-school Jacket quite a few children have their own jackets, and these can be worn at school. However, it is important to understand the difference between a jacket and a jersey or hoodie. If a child wears their own jacket, it must be a true jacket. This means it should have full lining, with a full length zip, and both look and act as a jacket. We do not accept sweatshirts, jerseys, hoodies or tracksuit tops as jackets.
- **4. School Jersey** these are polar fleece jerseys which provide warmth but do not give any wet weather protection.

Any of the above items fit within our uniform expectations during winter months. It is not necessary for a child to have all of these items. In general terms, children can get by with the raincoat and one other item. If you are unsure whether a 'non-school jacket' meets expectations, please contact us.

#### **Health Education Focus**

Each year we have one major focus in this area of the curriculum. In 2021 our focus is school wide, and is entitled **Keeping Ourselves Safe**. Depending on the year level, it looks at different ways in which children can be in unsafe situations, and ways to respond in these instances. The Keeping Ourselves Safe programme has been operating for many years, and provides children with both a knowledge and strategy base in order to give themselves the best chance of staying safe. Depending on year level, there can be some very personal terms and concepts used (body parts, unwelcome touching etc) and these are addressed in a sensitive and positive way.

We have the services of two Police Education Officers to assist with part of the KOS programme, which will run over the first three weeks of the term.

#### Thon '21

After a year off we are bringing back our annual Thon Fundraiser Event. It's a general knowledge theme, and we have given with the simple title of **Thon '21.** We always find the Thon event to be highly popular, both as an activity and also in terms of being a successful fundraiser.

Children will be bringing home their Thon '21 material on Thursday (tomorrow.) This will include their learning sheets, a sponsor form and a letter of explanation.

For now the two things to focus on are:

- Learning the Thon '21 answers
- Signing up Thon '21 sponsors.
